

Regular Meeting  
November 9, 2015

A Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Wanaque was held on Monday, November 9, 2015, at 9:30 P.M. in the Wanaque Municipal Building.

The Mayor called the meeting to order.

On roll call, the following Council Members responded: Balunis, Cortellessa, Leonard, Pasquariello, Pettet and Willse. The Mayor declared a quorum. The Borough Attorney and Borough Engineer were present.

The Mayor read the following Sunshine Statement: This is a Regular meeting of the Mayor and Council and adequate notice thereof has been given by advertising the date, time and place of the Regular meetings in the Suburban Trends and the Herald News newspapers and was e-mailed to these papers on January 2, 2015, and a notice thereof has been posted on January 2, 2015 on the bulletin board in the Wanaque Municipal Building, 579 Ringwood Avenue, Wanaque, New Jersey and a copy thereof has been on file in the office of the Municipal Clerk.

MINUTES:

October 19, 2015.

On entertainment of the Mayor, Councilmen Pasquariello and Pettet moved a motion to approve the aforementioned.

On roll call, all voted yes, and the Mayor declared the motion carried.

PROCLAMATION:

The Mayor said we all know what happened to people that pass away from Pancreatic Cancer and then read the following Proclamation:

DECLARING NOVEMBER 13<sup>TH</sup>  
"WORLD PANCREATIC CANCER DAY"

WHEREAS, in 2015, an estimated 48,960 people will be diagnosed with Pancreatic Cancer in the United States and 40,560 will die from the disease;

WHEREAS, Pancreatic Cancer is one of the deadliest cancers, is currently the fourth leading cause of cancer death in the United States and is projected to become the second by 2020;

WHEREAS, Pancreatic Cancer is the only major cancer with a five-year relative survival rate in the single digits at just seven percent;

WHEREAS, when symptoms of Pancreatic Cancer present themselves, it is generally late stage, and 73 percent of Pancreatic Cancer patients die within the first year of their diagnosis while 93 percent of Pancreatic Cancer patients die within the first five years;

WHEREAS, approximately 1,560 deaths will occur in New Jersey in 2015;

WHEREAS, Pancreatic Cancer is the 7<sup>th</sup> most common cause of cancer-related death in men and women across the world;

WHEREAS, there will be an estimated 367,000 new Pancreatic Cancer cases diagnosed globally in 2015;

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WHEREAS, the good health and well-being of the residents of Wanaque are enhanced as a direct result of increased awareness about Pancreatic Cancer and research into early detection, causes, and effective treatments;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and Borough Council designate November 13<sup>th</sup> as “World Pancreatic Cancer Day” in the Borough of Wanaque.

Todd Cohen thanked the Mayor and Council for the Proclamation and asked that people wear purple on the 13<sup>th</sup>. This is a growing problem. Pancreatic Cancer is on the rise and there is only a seven percent survival rate. If anyone is interested the website is Pancan.org.

The Mayor presented a plaque to honor Anthony Fiorello as the Fidelians awarded him with the “Man of the Year Award”.
