WHEREAS, the Borough of Wanaque has been a participating member of the New Jersey Intergovernmental Insurance Fund (hereinafter the “Fund”) established pursuant to Chapter 372, Laws of 1983 (N.J.S.A. 40A:10-36 et seq), and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Council of the Borough of Wanaque has determined that MEMBERSHIP IN THE “Fund” is the best interest of the municipality,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Municipal Council of the Borough of Wanaque in the County of Passaic and the State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1. The Borough of Wanaque hereby agrees to continue its membership in the “Fund” for a period commencing January 1, 2014 terminating on December 31, 2016 for the purpose of establishing the following types of insurance coverage:

- a) Workers Compensation and Employers Liability
- b) General Liability (including Police Professional & Public Officials Liability/Employment Practices Liability);

SECTION 2. For the purpose of contribution of sums into the “Fund” to be designated for administrative costs and claims, Borough of Wanaque hereby agrees to obtain the types of coverage from the “Fund” as are set forth in SECTION 1 of the Resolution and Indemnity and Trust Agreement to be signed by it.

SECTION 3. The Bylaws of the New Jersey Intergovernmental Insurance Fund have been adopted and accepted by the Local Unit and the Local Unit hereby agrees to conduct its membership in the “Fund” according to the rights and obligations set forth therein.

SECTION 4. The Mayor and Council are hereby authorized and directed to execute a written agreement signifying application for membership in the ‘Fund’ and are to execute such other agreements, including but not limited to the Indemnity and Trust Agreement, attached hereto as Exhibit A, in order to implement its membership in the “Fund” and to conduct itself according to the terms thereof.

SECTION 5. The Local Unit certifies that it has never defaulted on claims under a self insurance plan and that it has not had its insurance canceled for non-payment of premium for a period of at least two (2) years prior to this application.

SECTION 7. Severability. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this Resolution shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the Resolution shall be deemed valid and effective.

WHEREAS, on April 29, 2009 the Borough Council of the Borough of Wanaque adopted ordinance number 5-0-09 establishing a redevelopment plan for certain properties located in or near Ringwood Avenue...and establishing a mixed use redevelopment area; and

WHEREAS, the contract purchaser of the property situated at Block 435, Lot 5 and Lot 5.01 has requested that the redevelopment of this area in need of redevelopment proceed so that the environmental investigation and remediation may take place and the appropriate land use (or re-use) may be accomplished; and

WHEREAS, Borough Council desires that the current contract property owner, Greentree at Wanaque, LLC, Howell, New Jersey, or a successor or related entity be the designated Redeveloper to perform all project work in accordance with the objectives of the aforesaid redevelopment plan as may be modified to incorporate the appropriate land use and subject to Wanaque Planning Board site plan review; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council finds that it is in the best interest of the public to implement the aforesaid redevelopment project, with the contract property owner, and consistent with the redevelopment plan as may be amended or modified and subject to Wanaque Planning Board approval.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Borough of Wanaque, Passaic County, New Jersey, pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et seq., that Greentree at Wanaque, LLC, or a successor or related entity organized for the purposes of carrying out the aforesaid redevelopment project, is hereby designated as the redeveloper of the Block 435 development, in the mixed use redevelopment area located near Ringwood Avenue, upon the premises hereinbefore described, and subject to any required amendments or modifications of the redevelopment plan that may be agreed to in writing by the parties.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the above preamble (WHEREAS clauses) is made a part of this resolution as though it is a material and actionable part of this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-8, the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute on behalf of the Borough of Wanaque a Redevelopment Agreement, consistent with the adopted Redevelopment Plan (ordinance as may be amended), between the Borough of Wanaque and the herein designated redeveloper, Greentree at Wanaque, or a successor or related entity, so as to carry out the terms and conditions of the redevelopment project, as may be amended or modified; a copy of said agreement shall be placed on file in the office of the Borough Clerk upon execution thereof.
