

This is the July 2012 report for the Wanaque Police Department. There has been an increase in vehicular burglaries during the month of July. It should be noted all of the vehicles were unlocked when the thefts occurred. Currently investigations are on-going. Extra Officers were scheduled for details at the St. Francis Carnival. It was very successful with no major issues to report. Details were also put in place for the 4th of July. Complaints of Fireworks and Loud Parties were minimal.

Out of our scheduled 93 shifts, 72 or 77% did not have a full compliment of manpower. A total of 133 hours of overtime were incurred as well as 122 hours requiring Shift Commander pay.

Calls for Service:

1572 calls and investigations were conducted for the Month.

31 Arrests were made resulting in 90 charges being filed.

451 traffic stops were conducted resulting in the issuance of 269 summonses.
